Methodology

Survey questions were administered through the *TrendWatch Alberta Omnibus Survey* between October 14 and 22, 2025.

TrendWatch Alberta is a monthly omnibus survey of 900 Albertans, ages 18 and over. The margin of error for a probability sample of 900 people is plus or minus 3.3 percentage points, 19 times out of 20 (i.e., at a 95% confidence interval).

Survey Design

- Survey respondents were initially contacted at random by live telephone interviewers and given the option of:
 - answering the survey over telephone at that time,
 - answering over the telephone at a more convenient time, or
 - receiving the link and answering the survey on-line.
- The initial sample list contained approximately 70 per cent landline and 30 per cent cellphones.
- Interviewers made up to five attempts to reach each phone number in the sample before classifying it as unreachable.

Interviews

- All surveys were conducted by qualified interviewers working out of Trend Research's centralized CATI facility in Edmonton. Field supervisors were always present to ensure accurate interviewing and recording of responses.
- The interviewing staff at Trend receives extensive training on the proper administration of interviews and are closely monitored by supervisors. A minimum of 10 per cent of each interviewer's work was unobtrusively monitored for quality control in accordance with the standards set out by the Canadian Research Insights Council (CRIC).

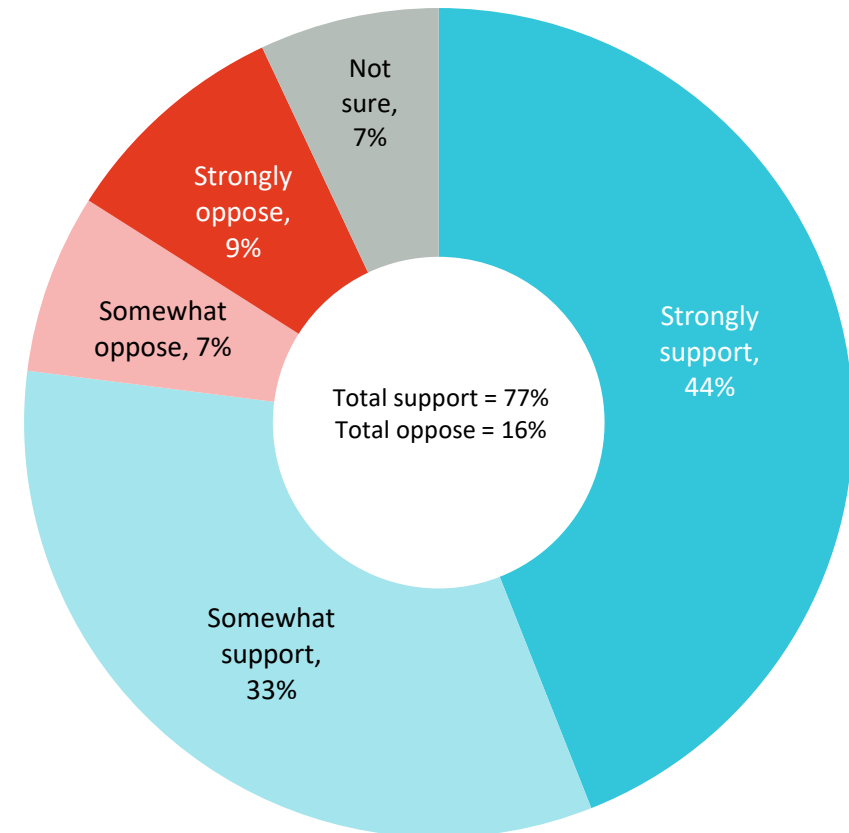
Research Findings

Support for Bill C-5

Just over three in four Albertans (77%) express support for Bill C-5, the Once Canadian Economy Act which allows the federal cabinet to fast-track major infrastructure project that are seen to be in the national interest. This includes 44 per cent who strongly support and 33 per cent who somewhat support Bill C-5. Another 16 per cent oppose the bill (9% strongly, 7% somewhat), and 7 per cent are not sure.

Those most likely to support Bill C-5 include:

- Those who are confident that federal efforts of developing infrastructure will be good for Alberta's economy (90%),
- Those with a university degree (86%),
- Those who support federal efforts to encourage smaller regional and local infrastructure projects (86%), and
- Calgarians (83%).



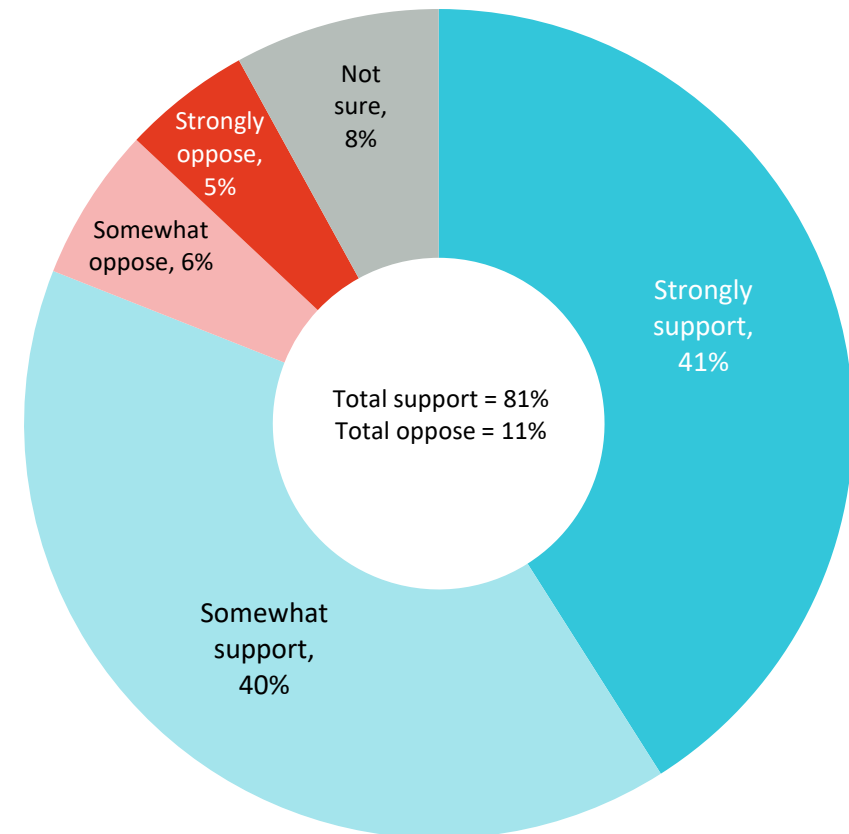

Development of Local and Regional Infrastructure

More than eight in ten Albertans (81%) support the idea of federal government encouraging the development of local and regional infrastructure projects that may not qualify as “major projects” under Bill C-5 and the auspices of the new Major Projects office. This includes 41 per cent who strongly support and 40 per cent who somewhat support this idea. Eleven per cent oppose this idea (6% somewhat, 5% strongly), and eight per cent are unsure.

Those most likely to support the idea of the federal government encouraging local and regional infrastructure include:

- Those who are confident that federal efforts of developing infrastructure will be good for Alberta’s economy (91%),
- Those who support Bill C-5 (90%),
- Those with a post-graduate education (88%), and
- Calgarians (84%).



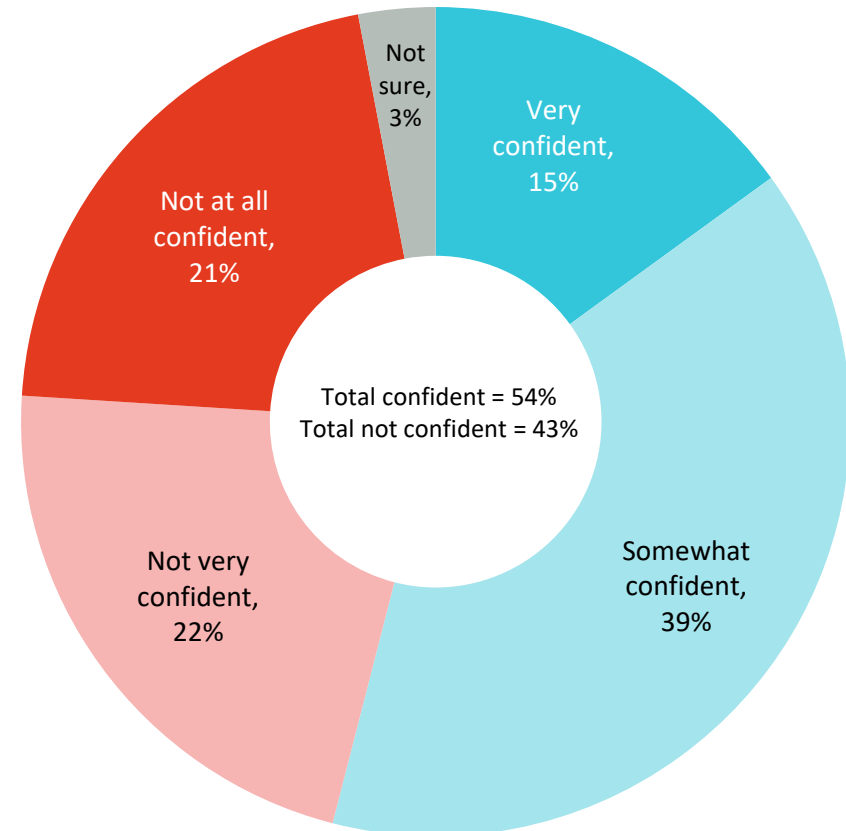

Confidence in Development of Infrastructure

Just over half of Albertans (54%) are confident that the federal government's efforts to develop infrastructure projects that will positively impact Alberta's economy, including 15 per cent who are very confident and 39 per cent who are somewhat confident. In contrast, 43 per cent are not confident (22% not very confident, 21% not at all confident), and three per cent are unsure.

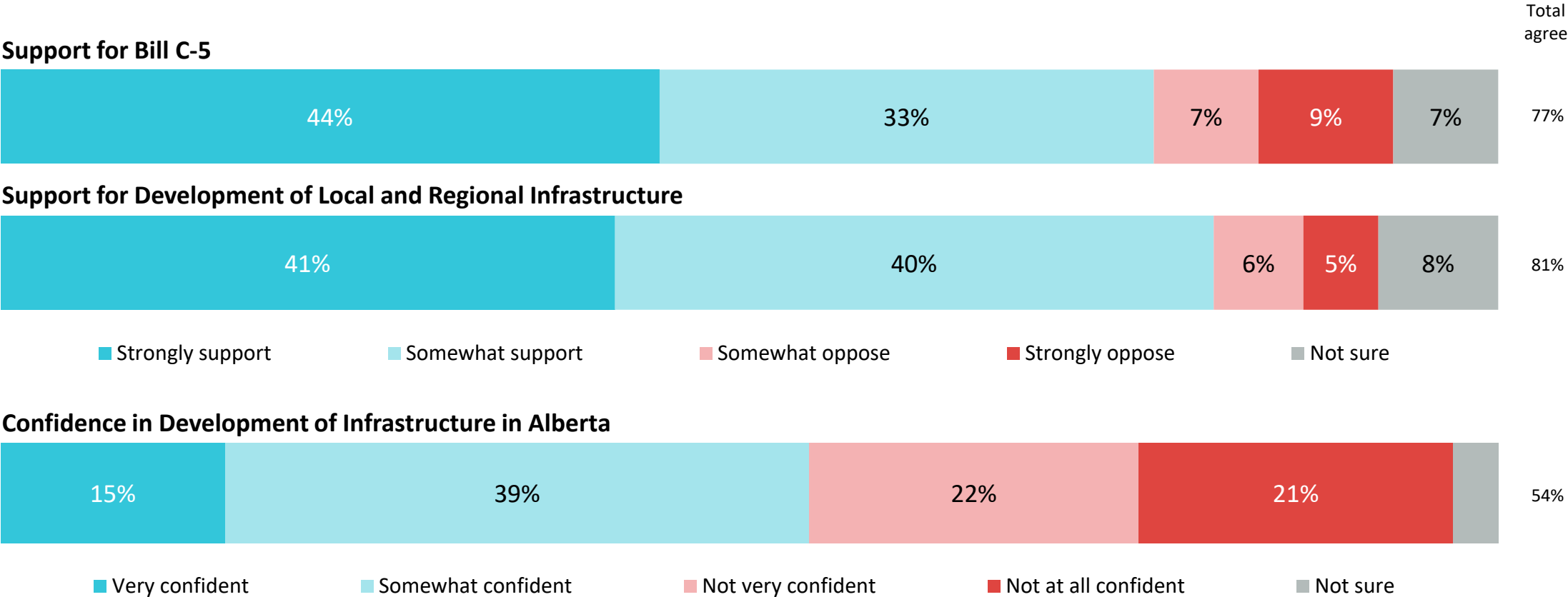
Those most likely to be confident include:

- Those with a post-graduate education (65%),
- Public sector workers (64%) ,
- Those who support Bill C-5 (63%),
- Those who support federal efforts to encourage smaller regional and local infrastructure projects (61%),
- Women (59%), and
- Calgarians or Edmontonians (58%).
